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GUMMERUS

Gummerus, founded in 1872, is Finland's third largest trade publisher with a list of 200 titles each year. It is owned by Swedish Storytel. (For titles published in Sweden, get in touch with Norstedts Agency, www.norstedtsagency.se.)

SCHILDTS & SÖDERSTRÖMS Schildts & Söderströms is Finland's largest Swedish language publisher with a history dating back 1891. Its imprint S&S publishes books in Finnish.

SILTALA PUBLISHING Siltala, founded in 2008, pub-

lishes about 40 titles a year. Its list includes both literary fiction and nonfiction.

TEOS PUBLISHERS Teos Publishers, founded in 2003, publishes about 45 new titles annually. The focus is on literary fiction, but the list includes also nonfiction and children's titles. Since 2024, Teos is owned by Siltala Publishing.

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

A bedtime book for the very little ones.

It's time for Juno to go to bed. But first Juno lights the moon and thinks of everyone else who will also be soon asleep. The kings in the castles, the Lego pieces on the floor and the pans in the dishwasher.

Karin Erlandsson takes the very youngest readers on a peaceful evening walk through Juno's world, where Karoliina Pertamo's tender illustrations allow everything to bathe in warm colors.

Juno Lights the Moon is Erlandsson and Pertamo's first collaboration.



Karin Erlandson (b. 1978) is a Finnish author writing in Swedish. She has previously published a series of middle-grade novels called *Song of the Eye Gemstone*. The first novel of four, *Pearl Fisher* (2017), received the Runeberg Junior Prize and was nominated for the the Nordic Council Children and Young People's Literature Prize, similarly to the fourth novel *Victor* (2019) and her later work, *Night Express* (2020).

Karoliina Pertamo (b. 1971) is an illustrator and graphic designer who illustrated her first book in 2010. She has been nominated for the Rudolf Koivu Prize (2012), Finlandia Junior Prize (2014 and 2015), Runeberg Junior Prize with two books (2020), and also for the Nordic Council Children and Young People's Literature Prize (2020).

A charmingly heartfelt story about friendship.

Rina and Marla get into a fight in the middle of a game. Rina gets annoyed and sad. But then she hears a strange whirring that sounds inviting. It is impossible to tell where the sound is coming from. Rina feels that it is leading her somewhere...

The chirping gets louder and louder, and Rina follows it to the edge of the city. There she finds the mysterious rainbow swallowtail butterfly – but there is also Marla, who has been waiting for her!

Rainbow Swallowtail is a colorful feel-good story about the meaning of friendship and how important it is to know how to ask for help and forgive.



Ilja Karsikas (b. 1978) is an illustrator and graphic designer known for his conversation-sparking children's books like *The Unicorn* (2022), *Under the Moon* (2020, in collaboration with Aki-Pekka Sinikoski), *Storm and Light* (2023) and *Rainbow Swallowtail* (2024). In addition to his visual work, Karsikas creates music and is involved in a number of artistic projects.

Being free is completely different. And what do they find outside the preschool? Another runaway, who needs to be protected from the dangers of the outside world!

The Runaways is wittily written by Malin Klingenberg and wonderfully illustrated by Maria Sann. Their previous collaboration, Skeleton, was published in 2022.



Malin Klingenberg (b. 1979) is a Swedish-speaking children's author from Finland. She has written six books of The Senior Squad series for young readers, a novel for teenagers, *Elk Girl* (2018), and several illustrated children's books, of which *The Secret Life of Farts* (2019), illustrated by Sanna Mander, has been translated to ten languages.

Maria Sann (b. 1982) is a Finnish illustrator who has in addition to children's books worked on book covers. In 2021, she was awarded with the prestigeous Rudolf Koivu Award. Together with Malin Klingenberg she has published three books, latest *Skeleton* (2022) and *The Runaways* (2024).

When Roni's skeleton suddenly glows in the dark, Teo bolts as if death itself were on his heels. But a human child with bunny paws doesn't run as fast as a real bunny. Teo trips over his paws and hurts himself.

There's nothing to do but go see the doctor and take x-rays.

Let's have a look at your skeleton, says the doctor. Teo is horrified: is there a skeleton inside me? Of course there is, his mother whispers tenderly. But Teo is chilled to the bone. Is there a skeleton inside everyone? What if the little brother living inside Mommy's tummy sees her skeleton and is frightened?

Skeleton is a tenderly told story about a child overcoming his fears while learning what each of us is made of. Some- times parts of us break and need to be fixed with a cast.

"Any lock will open when you find the right key."

It's late summer in 1989, and a girl has lost her home keys. Granny is crocheting a hat, Mum is making doughnuts, Pavel from next door is researching isomers, and Martta has painted a sun on the kitchen wall. It's a scorcher of a day – old men are playing chess, sitting in the shade of tall trees, and washing dries so quickly it's worth sitting down to wait for it. On days like this ice cream vendors are sweating, and beaches are chock full of people.

There's something very special about today. People have been whispering about it for weeks and it is finally about to happen. Today everyone will stand by the roadside and hold hands with one another, forming a chain of freedom across countries and borders.

In August 1989 some two million people formed a 600- kilometre-long human chain from Tallinn, the capital of Estonia, to Riga, Latvia, and again to Vilnius in Lithuania. The chain stood for independence and consisted of people of all ages. They stood hand in hand and demonstrated peacefully for hope of freedom.

It's a warm August day. A day I'll always remember. The day we found the key. The day I learned that there are no dull days, only days when you can do miracles.

Free is the second book written by Eppu Nuotio and illustrated by Sanna Pelliccioni that deals with historical events of the 20th century from a child's perspective.





Eppu Nuotio (b. 1962) is a bestselling author, whose extensive body of work includes novels, children's books, radio plays, plays, and television scripts. Her latest adult novel is the third instalment in a cosy mystery series about carpenter Raakel Oksa.

Sanna Pelliccioni (b. 1976) is an award-winning illustrator and children's author. Her picture books include *We Had to Leave* (2018), *I Remember You with Love* (2020), *Matias and Everything that Was Far Away* (2021) and *Forest Field Notes* (2022). Nuotio and Pelliccioni have created together so far two children's books, both about key moments in 20th century history from a child's perspective: *Sent across the Sea* (2022) and *Free* (2024).

With Penelope any mundane task turns into a wild adventure in fantasy land.

Penelope is a lovable and sharp pocket-sized girl full of attitude and mischief. In this series, Penelope encounters everyday tasks that, for the adults, seem simple enough – like eating the breakfast, brushing the teeth, and getting dressed. But when Penelope's imagination sets off, there is all of a sudden full speed and surprising turns!

The first installment of the series, *Penelope and the Perilous Porridge* (2022), deals with overcoming the dangers a healthy portion porridge poses. This story of the epic duel between a girl and her breakfast was a nominee for the Finlandia Junior Prize, the largest children's book prize in Finland.

In the second book, *Penelope and the Big Baby Tooth Ballyhoo* (2023), something strange happens. One of her teeth starts to wiggle. Will Penelope receive new sheep instead of new teeth? Will she meet the tooth fairy's cousin, the tooth imp?

The third book, *Penelope and the Curious Clothing Commotion* (2024), Penelope should get dressed, but she has a sneaking suspicion that the clothes have it in for her. If she does not watch out, there seems to be a fair chance the clothes will attack, or that something else as unexpected will happen...

"An ordinary bowl of breakfast porridge takes on increasingly astounding meanings in a picture book where the drama builds splendidly from spread to another. The dialogue between image and word easily traverses pages on which the element that seems visually and narratively impossible – porridge – changes, in the eye of the protagonist, to different forms: into an ambassador, a part of an art exhibition or an archaeological traverse.



What is a good friendship like?

Kaisa is Oskar's sister, and he is her brother. He plays on his own a lot, but he has one friend at nursery school, with whom he likes to draw pictures. His best friend is probably Mum.

Kaisa's friend group consists of Penni, Elsa, Ville, Ein, Paul, Minja, Iina and Ludde, at least. They're all in her daycare group. When Kaisa invites Elsa to stay over, and it's the most exciting and fun thing ever! But the pyjama party does not go as she planned, because Elsa gets nervous.

The adorable picture book deals with issues around friend ship: should a friend be like you? Where can you find friends, and is it ok to have a single friend?

Hannamari Ruohonen has previously written two books about the two siblings' everyday issues: *Kaisa and Oskar's Book of Favourites* (2019) and Kaisa and *Oskar's Book of Outings* (2019).



Hannamari Ruohonen (b. 1979) has illustrated numerous children's books. She has authored three books about A City of Animals (2007, 2008, 2009) that have been translated into French and Chinese. In 2017 came out My Lost Mother. After that, she started a series about siblings Kaisa and Oskar, which has so far three books: Kaisa and Oskar's Book of Favourites (2018), Kaisa and Oskar's Book of Outings (2019) and Kaisa and Oskar's Book of Friends (2023). Ruohonen's rich and expressive work has been praised by critics and the general public alike.

This little nipper wanted to be wise, strong, and wild – and wasn't going to wait around for a prince.

Leona is a young princess who does a runner when she learns of the fate that awaits her: she must marry a prince in order to save her kingdom.

Leona jumps from one princess fairytale to the next in order to save herself from the age-old burdens of princesses that lurk around every corner – marriage and household chores. Along the way she meets many characters including a melancholic mirror, the species-changing Swanhilda, and princes with a penchant for glass shoes, menacing pouts, and rescue mission obsessions – not to mention seven adult men who are short of stature and don't want to learn to clean and cook for themselves. The kind-hearted Leona helps everyone, but on her own terms. This princess refuses to be gentle, humble, and kind, just because that's what's expected of a fairytale princess!

The Princess Who Did a Runner is a picture book full of sharp humour that will even offer big children and adults plenty of food for thought.

"OUCH!" shouted the prince, whose lips Leona had just smacked her head into.

- "Another prince! This is all too much!" said Leona.
- "I was just trying to wake you with a kiss," explained the prince.

"Why would you even think about kissing someone who's asleep? Besides I'm already wide awake, thank you very much," said Leona.

A sea-borne Christmas adventure for young readers.

Twelve-year-old Oliver can't wait for Christmas to come. His parents are away for work, and he's spending two weeks at Grandma's place, which happens to be on a tiny island in the middle of nowhere.

Grandma and Oliver get on well but there isn't much to do, unless doing homework and sorting out Grandma's huge collection of china Santa Clauses are your idea of fun. Oliver can't help but wonder what's in the attic, the only part of the house that's off limits – until one day curiosity gets the better of him, and he sneaks in.

Oliver finds an old photograph of a uniformed sea captain, a few old nautical charts of the area, some letters, and a mysterious compass that doesn't point north, but always takes him where he wants to go. This is fine as far as Oliver's concerned, but soon more mysteries emerge: who was his ancestor Verner Strand really, and what befell him on Christmas Eve 100 years ago? Could the rumours about a hidden treasure in the archipelago be true?

The Smuggler's Treasure is a tale of adventure, mystery, and family secrets, culminating in a Christmassy happy ending. It shows that nothing is as it seems, and all that glitters isn't gold, while treasures can be found in the oddest places.

- But maybe the treasure's still there? Maybe it's just very well hidden?

– That's not impossible. But to find it you'd have to know which island to search for it on - and that knowledge went down with the region's most notorious smuggler.

A gripping adventure combining ancient Balto-Finnic myths with contemporary challenges.

In E*ndless Winter* it's June and there's a snowstorm. Nature has gone haywire, and no one knows what to do.

Returning home from a funeral of her grandfather, 10-year-old Eevi runs into the guardian elf of barley. She finds out the mystery behind the strange weather – and learns that if something isn't done soon, winter will last forever.

Eevi is soon drawn into a magical adventure with a group of elves. Their mission is to free the awakener of spring nature, whom the powerful and evil Kalevala witch Louhi has imprisoned in the Underworld. On the journey, Eevi encounters various magical creatures, gets lost in the forest and finally slips through a crack into the Underworld.

The story continues in *Dangerous Dream*. Eevi has a nightmare about the sun going dark. Does the dream have something to do with her adventures in the Underworld?

Eevi wakes up when her friend Otso walks into the room. Otso's sister is ill, and she needs help. Eevi happens to have a magical piece of jewelry needed for a healing spell, so she must return to the world of magic.

Soon it turns out that Eevi and her necklace are chased by the witch Louhi as well as various other evil spirits. On top of that, Otso disappears. Fortunately, there are many friendly helpers along the way and a quiet, nameless wolf cub who has its own plans. As the adventure progresses, Eevi notices that dreams are rarely just dreams and one must be very, very careful with them.



Mythical is a series of graphic novels that draws inspiration from ancient Balto-Finnic folklore. The third book, Dark Sun, will be out in 2025.



Miila Westin (b. 1987) is an illustrator, graphic designer and cartoonist living in Helsinki. Westin has illustrated Anja Portin's middlegrade novel *Radio Popov*, the winner of the Finlandia Junior Prize of 2020, which has traveled to over 25 areas. She graduated as Master of Arts in Visual Narrative from Aalto University of Arts and Design, completing her thesis on the visualizations of Finnish mythical creatures.

Thus begins an unforgettable adventure in a world governed by Misty Trees, above all the eldest of them, the fountain of all living, the enormous Everbark.


Anja Portin has quickly become a favourite among children's authors with her middle grade novel *Radio Popov*, now sold to 25 areas. She writes about children who take matters into their own hands when grownups do not want to take responsibility or are not there to do it. Portin's theme and style evokes comparisons with Astrid Lindgren and Roald Dahl, among others.



Anja Portin (b. 1971) is a Helsinkibased author who has written children's books, essays, nonfiction, and a novel (Obituary, 2019). She studied comparative literature and law at the Universities of Helsinki and Turku, and has worked as a journalist and an editor. Her middlegrade novel Radio Popov (2020) received the Finlandia Junior Prize as the best Finnish children's book of the year, and has been sold to twentyfive areas so far. In 2021, she published a picture book Matias and Everything that Was Far Away, illustrated by Sanna Pelliccioni. Her latest children's book is an adventure novel The Book of Misty Trees (2023).

Welcome to a world of fantasy you will not want to leave!

Vega is ten years old and lives with her father on Giraffe Island. Life goes along in its usual way, which in Vega's case means anything but usual. She sees things no one else does, like imaginary animals that keep her company. The bathroom is home to a gray bear whose fur is lathered with shampoo, and on the way to school she encounters Atle the asphalt beaver and the crosswalk zebra Zacharias.

Vega has never met her mother, and when she asks her father and her grandfather Hektor about her mother, they speak in mysteries. When Vega's father gets a not-so-nice girlfriend and Vega gets an unexpected pen pal, she decides to set out on an adventure to find out more about her mother.

Colored by magical realism, *A Giraffe's Heart Is Unbelievably Large* is a tale of longing to be part of a family, to find one's place in the world, and to be loved as one is. It's a superb read for a child alone or for parents and children together.

All aboard a magical express train heading towards Christmas – in 24 chapters!

Dania's granny lives in an old station building next to a disused railway. Every year Dania, her big sister Nanda and their parents move to their grandmother's for December in the run-up for Christmas. Granny has become older and more forgetful during the past years, and sometimes she speaks nonsense. One evening Granny seems exceptionally absent-minded, and then she disappears from her room. The same night Dania hears something and sneaks out to see what is going on. Not believing her eyes, she sees an express train is pulling up at the station.

Dania manages to stop the night train and the adventure begins. She boards the train that returns every night. On the train she meets Konrad, a boy her age, and it soon transpires that everyone on the night train has lost someone they love. But what is the purpose of the key Dania's Granny has been so insistent on? And who has actually lost whom?

An enchanting and wildly riveting story brimming with the magic of Christmas has been a success both in Finland and Sweden. It was awarded Runeberg Junior Prize, Finland's second biggest children's book award.



Karin Erlandson (b. 1978) is a Finnish author writing in Swedish, who has previously published a fourpart series of children's novels called *Song of the Eye Gemstone*. The first novel of four, *Pearl Fisher* (2017) received the Runeberg Junior Prize and was nominated for the The Nordic Council Children and Young People's Literature Prize, similarly to the fourth novel *Victor* (2019) and *Night Express* (2020).

Ghosts and crime for middle grade readers by Finland's crime queen.

Finland's rising crime queen Eva Frantz has become known also for her novels for children, all of them featuring adorably creepy suspense. The novels are set in decades and milieus perfectly suitable for ghosts, and they are sure to keep the middle-grade reader glued to the pages.

In *The Mystery of Raspberry Hill*, young Stina, sufferingfrom a lung disease, ends up treated in a sanatorium in the middle of the healing countryside. The building is vast and full of long corridors and echoes. It is also a very lonely place, until one day Stina meets Ruben. The boy starts turning up when they should be sleeping, taking her to nightly expeditions to forbidden parts of the building.

Little by little Stina starts to realize that everything is not quite right in the sanatorium. Why isn't her mother writing back to her? Why do the nurses seem so afraid? What really happened in the fire? And what is Ruben trying to warn her about?

In *Queen of the Night*, 12-year-old Viktor has moved to Helsinki from Paris and is missing home. However, when his mother, an opera singer, gets the role of the Queen of the Night in The Magic Flute, things start to look up. Viktor makes friends with Agnes, the stage designer's daughter, who seems to have psychic abilities.

Soon it starts to seem there is something spooky and malevolent hidden beneath the foundations of the thea- tre – and peculiar accidents keep happening in the

In *The Secret of the Helmersbruk Manor*, it is December 1975. 12-year-old Flora Winter and her mother arrive in the small seaside village. Christmas is coming, but Flora is not feeling Christmassy: Dad is gone, and Mum needs to work on her book. To do that, she has rented an old cottage on the edge of a big park. In the middle of the park is an abandoned manor.

But why does Flora hear the clip-clopping of hooves in the night, even though there is no sign of any horses? Who keeps leaving figures from an old nativity scene around the park? And who on earth is Egon, the boy in the green hat who appears in the park now and then and seems to want to make friends with Flora?

The spine-tingling ghost story about a secret of a manor, gripping and heartfelt, is told over 24 chapters and is a good reading in the run-up to Christmas. The novel is illustrated wonderfully by Elin Sandström.



From the depths of the seas and the darkest forests to fields and deserts and everywhere in nature, there are unsuspecting species whose importance is immeasurable to those around them. They are the keystone species.

The Irreplaceables introduces young readers to such species from all around the world. Among them are the Arctic region's little auk, the green humphead parrotfish of the tropics, lions of the African savanna, the non-biting midges living in almost every body of water on earth, and the North American white oak. These organisms are essential to other species and the interconnected web, the fundamental structure of nature.

Through twenty-nine individual species, a gradual understanding emerges of how nature functions and why protecting it is crucial.

The Irreplaceables, written by Juha Kauppinen in concise, easy-to-read yet knowledge-based abstracts, and vividly illustrated by Janne Toriseva, is an informative book that captivates readers from the middle grades to parents and grandparents.




Juha Kauppinen (b. 1975) has written about nature and the environment for the past twenty years and been awarded the Kanava Prize, the State Award for Public Information, and the Bonnier Grand Prize for Journalism. *The Essential Biodiversity: Pathways to the Natural World* (2022) was his cross-over take on the most important question of our time.

Janne Toriseva (b. 1978) is an awarded comics artist and illustrator, who has published several comic books and also written scripts and storyboards for *Angry Birds*. Benjamin is fourteen, and he's having the worst summer ever. His best friend Olivia is away at a music camp, and Dad has dragged him along on a field trip to the coast, where he and a team of archeologists are researching an excavation site. Dad thinks that the small findings and the stone-lined labyrinth they're working on are intriguing artefacts, whereas Benjamin only sees dusty rocks.

To make things worse, he has nothing to do, no one to be with, and he misses his mom. It's best not to think about her too much, as he is still adjusting to the fact that she's gone forever.

One day Benjamin finally makes a friend, Tristan, but soon realises that something is off: why do the townspeople hate Tristan's family so much? Why does Tristan sometimes act or speak as if he were from another time? Why does he act so strange around Dad's excavation site, of all boring things? And what is the truth about the mysterious labyrinth?

Mixing YA elements with Finnish folklore, *No Beginning, No End* is a moving story of adventure, growth, loss, magic, and first love told in Ellen Strömberg's humorous style that shows how the people who love us never really leave us, even when the opposite seems true. With No Beginning, No End Ellen Strömberg returns to YA literature after the wonderful success of We'll Just Ride Past, which won her the August Prize in 2022.

We have no beginning, and no end. And if there's one thing I've learned it's that neither do you humans. You are born and you die, you are born and you die, but you never really disappear completely.

Autumn and the school year have just started, but seventeen-year-old Juuli's head and feet already feel heavy. Especially her head. On her way to work, Juuli happens upon a fox in the street. Following behind it is a Watcher, who luckily doesn't notice her helping the fox escape.

The everyday world becomes strangely fractured when the same fox, Eduardo Silver, starts appearing in Juuli's dreams. In them, she's in a circus. But are her dreams really dreams?

Around this same time, Juuli befriends the street artist and activist Niko, his sister Nini and his old friend Iida. For a while, everything feels new and full of possibilities, but then something terrible happens.

Juuli sets out to find her friends, crossing a continent that has changed in peculiar ways. While on her journey she returns to forgotten childhood memories of a circus that was destroyed in a fire. She embarks on an amazing adventure where she meets her own self, her missing father, and events from the past.

This multilayered story transports readers to the totalitarian Europe of the recent future, to a magical parallel world, and into Juuli's memories. These are woven together toform a place where the falsehood of a restrictive environ- ment is juxtaposed against joy and imagination. In *The Circus of Dreams*, the world, and the human mind, feel lavishly multidimensional – wondrous, tragic, and beautiful.

With this colourfully illustrated early readers' series, children get to improve their reading skills with fun stories.

I'm a Reader series consists of so far nine books for new readers. Level 1 books include only a small amount of text in capital letters; with these books, the child will get con-fidence in her reading skills as the book advances easily. On level 2, the text is in lowercase letters, but the amount of text is still small. On level 3, the stories are longer and include chapters.

The stories in the books deal with ordinary issues the children encounter in their daily lives: spending time with family and friends, going to school and playing with friends. At the same time, they are discussing values and teaching skills: good sportmanship, the importance of apologizing, appreciating others, and making a difference.



Malin Klingenberg (b. 1979) is a Swedish-speaking children's author from Finland. She has written several books for middle-grade readers, a number of illustrated children's books, and a young adult novel.

Margareta Sandin (b. 1964) is an illustrator who has illustrated several children's books and textbooks. She often focuses on how to show the people's characters and feelings in the illustrations.

Ruby's family has a secret: they have wonderful powersof colour. The Hues are able to control the colours of their own possessions, and they can handle them and move them about by willpower. Ruby's colour is red and her big sister Skye's is blue, while their little brother Forrest is still looking for his colour and practising hard.

Ruby's Secret begins when the Hues, hiding their secret skills, move once more into a new neighbourhood. But this time, Ruby no longer wants to be an eternal outsider and decides to make an impression on her new friends.

In *Many-Coloured Mansion*, the focus is on Ruby's sister Skye. When the family takes a trip to a mansion in the archipelago, Skye gets to know Bruno, who can control the colour brown. With their friendship, she starts to learn about Greyness, the creature that thrives on the borders of evil and ambushes those who are not like the others.

In *The Shadow Guest*, Forrest is enthusiastically practicing using his colours: green, blue and yellow. One day the family comes across a surly, mysterious man who is half black, half white. At the same time, Greyness is spreading.

In *Danger in the Colour Spa*, Ruby and Skye spend their autumn vacation with Bruno's family at a colour spa, but it soon turns out there is something strange going on. Has also this something to do with greyness?

In *The Fiery Sisters*, twins Blaze and Glow travel to the Hues' family mansion to put an end to a chain of fires – they control the orange colour. But soon there is news from home: their brother Bruno has gone missing.

Each one of the Hues books has its own colour, used by Reetta Niemensivu in her expressive line drawings.





Vuokko Hurme (b. 1979) is a children's author based in Helsinki whose output includes nonfiction, novels and picture books for children. Her middle-grade trilogy, Rotation (2017-2019), has been published to a wide critical acclaim. In 2020, she started *The Hues* series with Ruby's Secret, which was continued by Many-Coloured Mansion in 2021. Hurme has also worked as an art educator, edited nonfiction on parenting and education, written articles on these themes and produced activity materials for children.

In a small-town school a boy sits in a class room, deep in thought. He's called Patrik, and today will be the most exciting day of his life, although he doesn't know it yet.

Soon enough the class tearaway, Irene, bullies Patrik into escaping from school. When he ends up on a wrong bus full of pensioners, it appears that one of the senior citizens has been kidnapped – and a group of villains are very interested in taking the other pensioners out of the game too...

In the Senior Squad series pensioners are living a secret life scuppering the evil plans of lowlifes with the help of two clever children, Patrik and Irene. The series includes six books: *Patrik and The Senior Squad* (2010), *Irene and the Moneyhoover* (2013), *Fake Bernice* (2015), *The Fantastic Alfredo* (2016), *Rakel's Miracles* (2017) and *The Magnificent Senior Match* (2020).

The Senior Squad series has been praised for its crazy humor, quirky characters and action-filled plots that are perfect for young readers. The fourth novel of the series, The Fantastic Alfredo, was awarded with Runeberg Junior Prize in 2017.

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
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
